Why do we need Essential Digital Skills?

Without digital inclusion, many people are at an unfair disadvantage and we risk missing out on great talent.

11.3 million people lack the full basic digital skills



4.3 million have no basic digital skills at all



5.4 million working adults are without basic digital skills

28% of those aged **60+** are offline

people with a **registered disability** are 4 times as likely to be offline

What are Essential Digital Skills?

Essential Digital Skills qualifications are the new national standard for basic digital literacy. They are funded by the ESFA as part of the Adult Education Budget (AEB) and are for learners with none or little digital skills.
