About this qualification

This qualification is designed to help learners build the knowledge and skills needed when working with children. It covers a diverse range of job roles and occupational areas working in children's settings including early years. Learners qualified at Level 3 may work as room supervisors/team leaders or deputise for the leader working under the supervision of the manager. The qualification confers occupational competence for childcare, learning and development in Northern Ireland.

It is suitable for those who wish to work or are working at an unsupervised level in children's care, learning and development in Northern Ireland.

Terminology relating to Autism in this document

Autism is described by The National Autistic Society as a complex, lifelong developmental disability that typically appears during early childhood and can impact a person's social skills, communication, relationships, and self-regulation. All learners MUST have access to either employment or work experience in a real work setting to support them to develop and practise their skills, and apply their knowledge at an appropriate level. This ensures that learners are able to demonstrate consistent competence at Level 3 to meet the requirements of the Level 3 Diploma in Children's Care Learning and Development (Northern Ireland).

Learners must have access to between 600-700 hours in a work setting that will facilitate development of their skills and knowledge at Level 3.

Progression opportunities

Learners who achieve this qualification could progress to:

- Level 3 Extended Diploma for Children's Care. Learning and Development (Northern Ireland)
- Level 5 Diploma in Leadership for Children's Care, Learning and Development (Management) (Northern Ireland)
- Foundation Degrees in a related subject

The qualification confers occupational competence for child care, learning and development in Northern Ireland. Learners could progress to the following job roles:

- day care room supervisor
- child care assistant
- child minder
- nursery practitioner
- pre-school worker
- out of school childcare worker
