About this qualification

This qualification is approved by the General Dental Council (GDC) and is designed for those who are working as an apprentice dental nurse and who wish to complete an apprenticeship, register with the GDC and qualify as a dental nurse.

It is a mandatory element within the Dental Nurse Apprenticeship Standard for England, and the endpoint assessment is fully integrated into this qualification.

This qualification covers all of the GDC learning outcomes, making it entirely fit for purpose for those wishing to qualify as a dental nurse.

This qualification comes with a comprehensive set of sample assessment tasks and associated marking guidance covering 100% of the knowledge outcomes within the qualification. These are provided free of charge to registered centres.



Qualification structure

Our unique and simple integrated structure means that learners are fully prepared for their end-point assessment when they reach gateway, having achieved all qualification content and met all GDC outcomes.

Learners must achieve and pass the 17 mandatory internal units. These units are internally assessed through a portfolio of evidence and are ungraded. On achievement of these units, learners will have reached 'gateway' and may begin their end-point assessment. The final 3 EPA units make up the end-point assessment. Each unit will consist of a single, discrete assessment. The qualification will only be awarded after the EPA units have been passed.

Assessment

The first 17 units are internally assessed through a portfolio of evidence. Optional sample assessment tasks and comprehensive marking guidance are provided to registered centres free of charge.

EPA units 1 to 3 (a knowledge test, an interview and a professional discussion) must be completed last and make up the end-point assessment of the apprenticeship standard.
