Qualification content, structure and outcomes

This qualification aims to provide you with the opportunity to develop the knowledge and skills to support individuals with stroke. The qualification will help you to understand:

- the impact of a stroke on daily living
- the associated complications for individuals following a stroke
- the changing physical needs of individuals affected by a stroke
- the communication factors affecting individuals following a stroke.

To achieve this qualification you'll need to complete **4 mandatory units**:

- Unit 01 Stroke awareness
- Unit 02 Understand stroke care management
- Unit 03 Support individuals to manage dysphagia
- Unit 04 Support individuals with specific communication needs

Optional units

There are also a number of optional units for you to choose from depending on your interests and needs.

You need to complete **26 credits** to achieve this qualification.

Successful completion of this qualification will support progression into a variety of job roles and occupational areas within Health and Social Care.

The units and structure of this qualification are based on the Skills for Care and Development's National Occupational Standards for Health and Social Care.

Similar qualifications

This is the only Level 3 qualification in Stroke Care Management offered by us and was designed to support progression from the Level 2 Award in Stroke Awareness.
